Jon Robertson, dean Lynn Conservatory of Music

Jamaican-born maestro Jon Robertson enjoys a distinguished career as a pianist, conductor and academician. He began his piano studies with Ethel Leginska at 7 years old and made his Town Hall debut in New York City at age 10. A

graduate of The Juilliard School of Music, he studied piano performance under Beveridge Webster, choral conducting with Abraham Kaplan at Juilliard, orchestral conducting with Richard Pittman of the New England Conservatory of Music and Herbert Blomstedt, former director of the Gweandhaus Orchestra (Germany). His conducting career spans the globe from symphony orchestras in Norway, China, Egypt, South Africa and Austria to the Redlands Symphony Orchestra in California, where he was principal conductor from 1982 until his retirement in 2016. Robertson is former chair of the Herb Alfred School of Music at UCLA. He continues to guestconduct and to perform in concert as a member of the Cole-Robertson Trio.

About the performers

Yvonne Lee, violin

Born in Malaysia, Yvonne pursued her musical education at Singapore's Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music (YSTCM) with Mr. Ng Yu---Ying, where she was awarded a full scholarship for her Bachelor of Music Degree. Yvonne enjoys both orchestral and chamber music. She was one of the founding members of the Malaysian Philharmonic Youth Orchestra and also has performed several projects with the Singapore's Metropolitan Festival Orchestra. As a chamber musician, she has performed in several concerts and master classes with her conservatory quartet for Takács Quartet, Julliard String Quartet, Miró Quartet and Shmuel Ashkenasi among others. Yvonne is currently a student of Carol Cole, pursuing her Master's Degree at the Lynn Conservatory of Music.

Yaroslava Poletaeva, violin

Yasa Poletaeva is a sought-after violinist hailing from Saint Petersburg, Russia. Described by "Manhattan International Artists" as a violinist whose "performances reflect a great musicality, depth of interpretation, and technical expertise needed to distinguish oneself in the world of professional performance." A graduate of the Saint Petersburg Conservatory, she has concertized in the United States, Russia, and several cities in Europe. This season, she will be touring in New York City, Boston, California, Florida, and in the South East Asia region as a member of the Contrasts Duo. She is currently pursuing a Master of Music degree under the tutelage of the internationally renowned violinist, Elmar Oliveira.

Kayla Williams, viola

Kayla Williams began playing classical violin when she was four years old. At age eleven, she discovered her passion which is playing the viola. A natural violist, she was selected to participate in Florida's All-State Orchestras during each year of eligibility in both middle and high school. Kayla has played in various artist master classes for Robert Vernon, Gilad Karni, and Nicola Benedetti, to name a few. Kayla is currently pursuing her Bachelors degree in Viola Performance at Lynn Conservatory under the instruction of Ralph Fielding. When Kayla isn't playing her viola, she enjoys singing playing jazz, bluegrass, and new grass on her fiddle.

Elizabeth Lee, cello

Elizabeth Lee began her cello studies with Metta Watts and Thomas Kraines at age 10 in Philadelphia. She has played in the Philadelphia Youth Orchestra, the Settlement Music School's Trowbridge Chamber Orchestra as an Advanced Study Scholarship recipient, and the Youth Chamber Orchestra of Temple University Music Preparatory Center for Gifted Young Musicians. In 2014, Elizabeth performed concertos with the Lansdowne Symphony and Ambler Symphony as a recipient of the Elmer and Louise Menges Scholarship. She is currently pursuing her Bachelor's degree in music performance with David Cole.

Amy Nickler, double bass

Born and raised in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, Amy Nickler began playing the violin at age six. She later switched to the double bass in 7th grade and has loved it ever since. While attending the Alexander W. Dreyfoos School of the Arts, Amy participated in many performances that were recognized nationally while being a member of the Dreyfoos Philharmonic, such as the Heritage National Orchestra Festival at Carnegie Hall, and the National Invitational Orchestra Festival at the Chicago Orchestra Hall. She is currently pursuing her Bachelor of Music Degree at Lynn Conservatory with Professor Timothy Cobb, Principal Double Bassist of the New York Philharmonic.

Alla Sorokoletova, flute

Flutist Alla Sorokoletova has been critically hailed as the "crystal, fiery voice of flute" with an "enchanting style of performance" by the noted magazine, "The Culture of Uzbekistan". For three decades Alla has been bringing her special brand of music to audiences around the globe with performances in places as diverse and far-ranging as Uzbekistan, Russia, Ukraine, India, Romania, Switzerland, and the United States. Her professional career began in 2005, when she was named the first-prize winner in the Republic Woodwind Competition, whereupon she was named principal flute, and the youngest member of the Alisher Navoi Opera and Ballet Theatre Orchestra in Tashkent. While a member of the Alisher Navoi Orchestra. Alla attended the The State Conservatory of Uzbekistan. She was also a member of the collaborative staff for the Chamber Music Department, and taught at the Uspenskiy Music School for Gifted Children, as well as the Tashkent International School. She earned her Bachelor of Music in flute performance and conducting under the guidance of Bahodir Salikhov in 2010. Upon completion of her studies, Alla performed as a soloist with various orchestras throughout Uzbekistan. Highlights included solo performances with the National Symphony Orchestra, the Tashkent Conservatory Orchestra, the Turkistan Chamber Orchestra, the Omnibus Symphony Orchestra, and the Soloist of Uzbekistan Orchestra. In 2009, she collaborated with the composer Felix Yanov-Yanovsky, and premiered his piece, "Fabula 5" for flute and Chamber Orchestra with the Turkistan Philharmonic. In 2014, Alla began work on her Performance Certificate in Flute at the Lynn Conservatory of Music with professor Jeffrey Khaner. She was the winner of the 2014 concerto competition at Lynn, and performed the Doppler Concerto with Lynn Philharmonia. In 2015, she won the Lyric chamber music competition which resulted in a performance in the 2016 New York Lyric Chamber Society's "Exciting New Prodigy Series." Ms. Sorokoletova is the recipient of a special award from the Nelson Family and National Society of Arts and Letters.

Darren Matias, piano

Filipino pianist Darren Matias started playing the piano at the age of 14. His rapid musical development yielded to a debut with the Philippine Philharmonic and has been a musician ever since. From then on, he concertized in the United States, Russia, Philippines, and in several cities in Europe. As a sought-after soloist, he has worked with Maestro Guillermo Figueroa, Jon Robertson, Jeffrey Meyer, George Schram, Matthew Wardell, and Herminigildo Ranera, to name a few. His Charlotte Symphony debut was met with an enthusiastic response that was described as "the most exciting performance of the season

Sohyun Park, piano

Sohyun Park has a deep love for the piano and chamber music. She has performed the music of Russian composer Sophia Gubaidulina as well as being the double bass accompanist at the Seoul International Festival in May 2014. Ms. Park has worked at the Seoul National University as a collaborative pianist for double bass studio from 2012 to 2014. She started her piano studies at the age of seven and was accepted to the Anyang Arts High School. Ms. Park entered Dongduk Women's university for her Bachelor of piano solo performance degree. She was chosen to debut in their opening concert. Ms. Sohyun is studying towards a Professional Performance Certificate at the Lynn University Conservatory with Professor Lisa Leonard.

Bailey-Michelle Collins, piano

Bailey-Michelle Collins began her piano studies at the age of five in Gainesville, Florida. She has since participated in a number of music festivals nationwide, where she has had the privilege to work with renowned instructors such as Natalya Antonova, Robert Roux, and Julian Martin. As a developing soloist, she received scholarship awards from various organizations including the Blount-Slawson Young Artists Competition and the Florida Federation of Music Clubs Junior Convention. At age 16, she made her orchestral debut under maestro Robert Gary Langford as winner of the David Hubbell Concerto Competition. Bailey studied with Dr. Kevin Robert Orr throughout high school at the University of Florida, and she began her undergraduate studies with Dr. Roberta Rust at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music in Boca Raton, FL in fall 2016.
