BIOGRAPHIES

Jesse Yukimura grew up near Seattle, Washington, and started playing the viola at age nine. Since then, he has participated in programs that have brought him to concert halls across the country, from Benaroya to Disney to Carnegie, as well as across the Pacific to China and Singapore. In 2013, Jesse received a Master of Music Degree from Lynn Conservatory. At Lynn, Jesse has been instrumental in forming and organizing the Lynn New Music Ensemble since 2012, and has sat principal violist in the last three Lynn Philharmonia seasons. He was also a winner of the 2012 Lynn Concerto Competition, performing as a soloist with the orchestra in December of that year. Jesse completed his undergraduate work at Oberlin Conservatory, where he studied with Professor Peter Slowik, receiving a Bachelor of Music in viola performance in 2011, along with a Bachelor of Arts in chemistry from Oberlin College. Jesse has a wide range of interests in both the natural sciences and the arts, from particle physics and marine biology to Baroque and Contemporary classical music. This year, Jesse is continuing his studies with Professor Ralph Fielding at Lynn Conservatory, pursuing a Professional Performance Certificate, which he will receive in May.

Tatiana Lokhina was born in 1985 in Moscow (Russia). She took her first music lessons at the age of six from her mother who graduated from the Moscow conservatory. At seven, she entered the School of Music in Moscow and in 2001 she continued her studies at the State Musical Institute named after M. Ippolitov-Ivanov where she got her Bachelor's degree with Mikhail Senovalov and Valentina Pavlova, herself a former pupil of the great teacher Felix Blumenfeld who shaped the Russian pianistic school through such pianists as Simon Barere and Vladimir Horowitz. Tatiana continued her education in Musikhochschule (Hamburg, Germany) with Karen von Bueren. Tatiana is a winner of numerous Russian and international prizes, she took part in Music festivals in Russia, Italy, Austria and Germany. She worked as a staff pianist with prof. Liudmila Egorova (violin), Marina Muzychenko (singer; choir). Baroque music has always had a strong influence on Tatiana, in 2007 she took her first harpsichord classes at Moscow Conservatory with Maria Uspenskaia. Her program includes solo works by Bach, Beethoven, Brahms, Rachmaninow, Scriabin, Grieg, Medtner etc., concerts by Beethoven, Grieg and Rachmaninov, chamber music by Bach, Beethoven, Grieg, Schumann, Schostakovitch, Reinecke etc. Tatiana is currently pursuing her Master's degree in collaborative piano at Lynn University (Florida) with prof. Lisa Leonard.

Pianist Sheng-Yuan Kuan has received accolades from many competitions, including the 13th Beethoven Piano Competition in Vienna (Best Female Pianist Award, 2009), the 12th Taipei Chopin International Piano Competition (3rd Prize, 2008), Corpus Christi International Competition in Texas (2nd Prize, 2008), and New York Kosciuszko Chopin Piano Competition (3rd Prize, 2003). Ms. Kuan has been a featured artist at the Heifetz International Music Institute, KUAF/Fulbright Summer Chamber Music Festival, and Baltimore Symphony Orchestra's Chamber Music by Candlelight series. She has performed alongside Nobuko Imai, Stefan Jackiw, Stephen Taylor, Daniel Phillips, Tim Eddy, Richard Stolzman, Keng-Yuen Tseng, Time for Three, and members of the Borromeo, Parker Quartets and Apollo Trio. Currently serving as the collaborative pianist at Lynn University's Conservatory of Music, Ms. Kuan holds degrees from the Yale School of Music and the Manhattan School of Music. She is a candidate for the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the Peabody Conservatory.
