We continue to closely monitor the evolving coronavirus outbreak. This is a fluid situation, and we are diligently evaluating each new development and adapting to new guidance from the **CDC**, Florida Department of Health and other agencies.

No cases of COVID-19 have been reported at Lynn, and we continue to take significant measures to ensure the health and safety of our students, faculty and staff, including:

- **Lynn University has moved to online classes as of today**, continuing through the end of the semester. Students who engage in experiential learning in their courses will receive additional information from their instructors.
- **We have postponed mass gatherings and are taking safety precautions to limit small group activities to no more than 10 people.** See lynn.edu/events for regular updates about the status of specific events.
- **We have suspended athletics competition for the remainder of the spring semester** due to guidance by the NCAA Board of Governors.
- **We are directing, students, employees and visitors to follow CDC travel guidelines.** Employees should avoid all non-essential travel. Students, employees and visitors who have traveled through **CDC advisory** areas with widespread transmission, including cruise ships with a confirmed COVID-19 case, should stay home for 14 days before returning to campus.

Reminders about other important updates:

- **Our residence halls remain open, and we continue to provide dining and student services.** If students wish to depart campus to study from home due to the coronavirus, they may do so. We're asking all residential students to complete a **Housing Intent Form** as soon as possible to let us know their plans. No guests are currently permitted in the residence halls.
- **Employees interested in teleworking options** should contact their supervisor to determine what is appropriate for their specific circumstances.
- **Employees unable to work remotely or in-person due to school closures** may be permitted to use available paid leave time (including sick time) during their absence. Contact eservices@lynn.edu with questions.
