Oksana Rusina has been recognized for her powerful sound and great imagination. Ms. Rusina obtained her Bachelor's degree in Music Performance at the University of Music and Performing Arts in Munich, Germany where she studied with cellist R. Ginzel. Oksana performed with the "Philharmonie der Nationen" under Maestro Justus Frantz and participated in "Junge Philharmonie Koln" under Maestro Volker Hartung. She has performed in Australia, Norway, Spain, Canada and Germany as the principal cellist of various orchestras. Presently, Ms. Rusina is in her first year of Master's program at Lynn University Conservatory of Music, studying with David Cole.

Aziz Sapaev, the winner of the numerous awards: first prize in the First International Young Musicians' competition, first prize in national cello competition in Edirne, Turkey, third prize in the 5th International Young Musical Talents, started his cello studies at age 13 at Uspenskiy's School for Musically Gifted Children in Tashkent, Uzbekistan and completed his secondary education in Trakya University in Turkey. During these years of education, Aziz has been engaged in solo, chamber music and orchestral concerts in different cities of Turkey. Actively involved in chamber music, Aziz has performed with leading Turkish musicians such as Gülşen Tatu, Rüşen Güneş and Özcan Ulucan. Xinou is currently studying at Lynn University Conservatory of Music with Carol Cole.

Student biographies

Joseph Adkins is a freshman studying with Carol Cole.

Alexandru Briscaru started his career at the age of 5, playing violin at the School of Arts “Octav Bancila.” At 14 he continued his studies as a violist until he graduated in 2000 and enrolled with the Iasi Conservatory of Music in Romania. In the period 2000-2005 he appeared as a soloist with the “George Enescu” Orchestra on the Iasi and other Romanian cities stages as well as in Bulgaria, Ukraine and Italy. In 2005, he majored in viola performance and viola teaching in 2005. Alexandru won several national music competitions and participated in numerous international music festivals in Germany, Italy, France, Bulgaria, Ukraine, Moldavia, Greece, Turkey and the United States. Currently, he is pursuing his Professional Performance Certificate at Lynn Conservatory studying with Ralph Fielding.

Adam Diderrich grew up in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where he started playing violin at age 5. In 2003, he completed his Bachelor of Music degree and the Professional Performance Certificate at the University of Toronto while studying with professor Atis Bankas. From 2004 to 2007, Adam performed with the New World Symphony in Miami Beach. Since that time he has been an active freelance musician in South Florida. He performs with many groups, including the Palm Beach Symphony, Boca Symphonia, Florida Grand Opera, and Seraphic Fire. Adam also plays styles of music other than classical. He loves improvising and recently finished collaborating on a blues album.

Born in London ON Canada, **Rebecca Diderrich** completed two ARCT performance diplomas with the Royal Conservatory of Toronto as a pianist and violinist at the ages of 18 and 19. In 2004, she finished a Bachelor of Music Performance degree at the University of Toronto where she studied the violin with Lorand Fenyves. After deciding that her true musical love was the viola, she won a section position with the Palm Beach Opera Orchestra in 2005 and has been playing with that orchestra ever since. Mrs. Diderrich performs with many other ensembles in South Florida, including the Atlantic Classical Orchestra and the Palm Beach Pops and she appeared as a guest musician in the 2006 and 2008 Palm Beach Chamber Music Festival. Mrs. Diderrich is currently pursuing a Professional Performance Certificate at Lynn University with Ralph Fielding.

Zhou Jiang, pianist, was born in Kunming, Yunnan Province, China in 1986. Ms. Jiang started to learn piano at the age of 5. She obtained the China Musicians' Association's Piano Performance Level 10 for Amateurs (Highest Level) at thirteen. Due to her excellence in piano, she had a chance to perform in six European countries in 1998. In 2004, she studied as an undergraduate student at Shanghai Conservatory of Music. Presently, Ms. Jiang is a Professional Performance Certificate student at Lynn University Conservatory, studying collaborative piano with Tao Lin.

Born in Seoul, South Korea, cellist **Jonah Kim** moved to the United States to begin his musical studies at seven years of age. After a year of instruction from his father, he was accepted to the Juilliard School, where he studied with full scholarship. Jonah has pursued a solo career, working with orchestras such as Philadelphia Orchestra, the National Symphony Orchestra, and the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra. As a recitalist, Jonah has performed in major venues including the Kennedy Center (Washington D.C.), Kimmel Center (Philadelphia), and the Kravis Center (W. Palm Beach). Winner of numerous competitions, Jonah was broadcast on radio for WHYY and WITF, as well as on television for NBC and CBS. In 2000, Jonah enrolled to the Curtis Institute of Music. For 6 years, Jonah studied at the Curtis Institute under the tutelage of Orlando Cole and Peter Wiley, as well as occasional instruction from solo cellist Lynn Harrell. Currently, he divides his time between Prague, New York City, and Boca Raton and is in his junior year at Lynn University Conservatory of Music studying with David Cole.

Seul-A Lee began violin training at age 4, and after two years of studying she was accepted into the studio of Russian pedagogue Ludmilla Adjemova, and later Elena Zaitseva, at the special music school of Rymsky-Korsakov Conservatory of Music in St. Petersburg, Russia. Seul-A was featured as a soloist with the Symphony Orchestra of Tele-Radio of St. Petersburg, the Chamber Orchestra of Estonia, the St. Petersburg Music Conservatory Symphony, and the St. Petersburg State Symphony Orchestra. She is a winner of 2002 International Competition of Young Musicians Tallinn in Estonia, Austria's 2004 Schloss Zell an der Pram International Violin Competition, finalist in the 2003 Mravinsky Music Competition in Russia and in the 2004 Mlodzi Wirtuozi International Violin Competition in Poland. In 2006, Seul-A immigrated to the United States, and in Los Angeles she studied with violinist Jay Zhong, an Auer violin school exponent, professor of violin at the California State University. Seul-A is a student of the eminent violin master, Elmar Oliveira.

Edgar Leite, violin, graduated from Sao Paulo State University, and has performed with many important Brazilian orchestras, including the State of Sao Paulo Symphony and the Sao Bernardo Philharmonic. He was a concertmaster with the Bank Boston Chamber Orchestra and the Villa-Lobos Chamber Orchestra. He has won chamber music competitions in Sao Paulo and was a finalist in the Gaetano Zinetti Competition in Verona, Italy. He holds the Professional Performance Certificate from Lynn University, where his teachers were Sergiu Schwartz, Elmar Oliveira, and Carol Cole.

Yunyue Liu, pianist, was born in Shanghai, China in 1984. Yunyue started studying piano at the age of five. She studied as an undergraduate student at Shanghai Normal University in 2003 with Professor Shijie Ge and earned her Bachelor of Music Education in 2007. As a delegate of Shanghai Normal University, she was invited to perform in the Shanghai Spring International Music Festival in 2004, and an exchange performance in 2005 in Hong Kong. She obtained a scholarship during the four years of her bachelor degree and was granted the Advanced Certificate in YAMAHA Fundamentals Grade 5 in 2007. She was the only person who passed the
