Lynn announces Fall 2020 event updates

Lynn University recently announced adjustments to all Fall 2020 on-campus events, student activities and programming. The decisions follow months of hard work by university leadership and dedicated workgroups tasked with reconfiguring operations for an eventual return to campus.

Event cancellations

The current environment makes it challenging for national troupes to rehearse and for groups to travel. Additional guidelines require limited capacities, increased cleaning and sanitation measures, and new social distancing procedures. As a result, the university announced that:

- It will not host external guests for any Live at Lynn, Lynn Conservatory of Music or Lynn Drama performances through the end of December 2020.
- All previously announced Live at Lynn performances and university-wide events with external guests, including Parents and Families Weekend and holiday parties, are cancelled through December 2020.

At this time an exception to the "no external guests" policy has been made for only Welcome Weekend. Each student can enter campus with only two guests during their check-in time slot.

In addition:

- Study abroad programs will not take place.
- Off-campus academic and student involvement excursions are cancelled.

Reimagined events

Lower-density learning, living and working experiences are central to Lynn's plans to return to campus. To support this, the university has also redesigned how students and the community may continue to experience events.

- Many events will take place through a reimagined delivery, including traditions like the Employee Welcome Back Breakfast, the State of the University and Founders Day.
- Lynn will livestream select student performances, including Lynn Philharmonia and other rehearsals.
- The Center for Student Involvement will host small capacity on-campus programs. Most programs will adopt a hybrid format, which include virtual and remote participation options.
- Given the Sunshine State Conference's cancellation of Fall 2020 games, coaches and athletics staff will remain committed to training student-athletes. Future competitive experiences may also be defined at a later date.
