BIOGRAPHIES

[Mark Huskey](#), born and raised in the Tennessee Valley, received his musical education at the Walnut Hill School for the Arts, The Cleveland Institute of Music, and Lynn University. His primary teachers include Jeffrey Khaner, Joshua Smith, Judy Grant, and Doriot Dwyer. In addition to his formal studies, Mark has performed in masterclasses with Elizabeth Rowe, Mathieu Dufour, Robert Langevin, Denis Bluteau, Mary Kay Fink, Linda Chesis, Bonita Boyd, Denis Bouriakov, Jim Walker, Geralyn Coticone, Linda Toote, Gary Schocker, and the Berlin Philharmonic Wind Quintet. With his focus being on orchestral playing, Mark has been fortunate enough to have played under many great conductors including Alan Gilbert, Fabio Luisi, Giancarlo Guerrero, Asher Fisch, Daniel Hege, Leonard Slatkin, Kent Nagano, JoAnn Falletta, Jean François Rivest, Michael Tilson Thomas, Guillermo Figueroa, Carl Topilow, Herbert Blomstedt, Pinchas Steinberg, James Feddeck, and Sasha Mäkilä.

Filipino pianist [Darren Matias](#) is an active soloist and chamber musician. He started playing the piano at the age of 14 and has been a musician ever since. He appeared as soloist of the New York Festival Orchestra, Charlotte Symphony, Philippine Philharmonic, Lynn Philharmonia, Florida Atlantic Symphony, orchestras throughout the Philippines and has been orchestral pianist of the New World Symphony and South Florida Symphony. He won 1st prize at Ultimate Pianist Competition in Manila, Philippines, Florida Atlantic Concerto Competition, Lyric Chamber Music Competition, and was finalist at the Carnegie Hall Fellowship, Coleman, and Fishoff Competitions. He was featured in the master classes of Gary Graffman, Leon Fleisher, Philippe Entremonte, and Phillip Evans. He appeared as a guest artists in Alexander Toradze's Piano Studio Concert and as Mr. Liberace at the Kravis Center. Mr. Matias earned his Masters and Performance Certificate degrees under the tutelage of Roberta Rust. He is currently pursuing his Performance Certificate in Collaborative Piano under Lisa Leonard at Lynn University Conservatory of Music.
