Presently, Molin is studying with Roberta Rust.

Flutist, Jessica Aura Willis, is currently studying with Renee Siebert as a candidate for Master's degree on full scholarship at Lynn University in Boca Raton, Florida. Native to New York, Ms. Willis can regularly be found performing with Ensemble 212, Manhattan Symphonee, and Di Capo Opera Theater among others in New York City. Her studies started when she began attending Interlochen Arts Camp, and the Tanglewood Institute during high school. She was a member of the New York Youth Symphony, playing orchestral and chamber music in Carnegie Hall. Miss Willis holds a Bachelor Degree from SUNY Purchase having studied performance with Tara O'Connor, and also studying economics.
