Svetlana Kosakovskaya, a Russian violinist from St.Petersburg, started playing the violin at the age of five and at nine years of age began performing. In 2003, she graduated with honors from the Special School of Music of N.A.Rimsky-Korsakov Conservatory-Academy in St.Petersburg (class of Prof. Vladimir Ovcharek), and in 2006, graduated from St.Petersburg Conservatory-Academy (Diploma cum laude).

Since 1994, Ms. Kosakovskaya has participated in a number of performances in Russia, Germany, France, Hungary, Belgium, USA, and appeared as a soloist with different orchestras in Russia and USA. Also, she has taken Master Classes with V. Marshner-Germany, V. Yaroshevitch-Israel, A. Bogdanyan-Russia, R. Waterman-Great Britain, Z. Bron – Germany, M. Trabucco-Italy; R. Totenberg, J. Silverstein, E. Rosenbleth, Sh. Kloss, L. Kaplan, M. Kopelman - USA. Ms. Kosakovskaya is a winner of 6 competitions – among those Naftzger Competition (Whichita, USA); 4th E. Mravinsky International Competition in St. Petersburg, Russia (1st Prize); 2d A. Glazunov International Competition in Paris, France (1st Prize and Grand Prize); 3d International Symphony Competition in Volgograd, Russia (1st Prize). A number of diplomas and scholarships were received, including a scholarship of the Young Talents of Russian Federation as well as the Special Scholarship of the President of Russian Federation. Ms Kosakovskaya received a Master's Degree in violin performance (January 2009) and a Performance Certificate (June 2010) from DePaul University School of Music, Chicago (class of Prof. Ilya Kaler), as well as Professional Performance Certificate from Lynn University Conservatory of Music (May 2012, class of Prof. E. Oliveira). At present moment, Ms. Kosakovskaya is working on a Master of Music Degree at Lynn University Conservatory (Boca Raton, Florida) under instruction of Prof. Elmar Oliveira.

Pianist Sheng-Yuan Kuan has performed at the Kennedy Center, Weill Recital Hall, Taiwan National Concert Hall, and Musikverein in Vienna. She is a featured artist at the Heifetz International Music Institute, KUAF/Fulbright Summer Chamber Music Festival, Baltimore Symphony Orchestra's Chamber Music by Candlelight series, and the Sylvia Adalman Chamber Concert Series at Peabody Conservatory. Tim Smith of the Baltimore Sun praised Ms. Kuan as "(having) admirable technical finesse and expressive flair at the piano." Ms. Kuan has collaborated with famed musicians such as Nobuko Imai, Stefan Jackiw, Espen Lilleslatten, Richard Stolzman, KengYuen Tseng, Time for Three, and members of the Borromeo and Parker Quartets and Apollo Trio. She also made appearances at music festivals such as Bowdoin, Aria, Sarasota, Yellow Barn, Gijon Piano Festival and Norfolk Summer Music Festival. Ms. Kuan has received accolades from many competitions, including the 13th Beethoven Piano Competition in Vienna (Best Female Pianist Award, 2009), the 12th Taipei Chopin International Piano Competition (3rd Prize, 2008), Corpus Christi International Competition in Texas (2nd Prize, 2008), and New York Kosciuszko Chopin Piano Competition (3rd Prize, 2003). She was also the recipient of Honolulu Morning Music Club Scholarship, Peabody Conservatory's Career Development Grant, Chamber Music Awards and Accompanying Assistantship. Currently serving as the collaborative pianist at Lynn University, Ms. Kuan holds degrees from the Yale School of Music and the Manhattan School of Music. She is a candidate of the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the Peabody Conservatory under the guidance of Professor Boris Slutsky. For more information please visit Kuanpiano.weebly.com.
