A native of the Netherlands, Schram is resident conductor of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra and of the Nashville Symphony in Tennessee. He has enjoyed an international conducting career, including engagements in Korea, Switzerland and the Netherlands. His guest conducting appearances have included the former Florida Philharmonic, Dallas Symphony Orchestra, Tucson Symphony, Oklahoma City Philharmonic, Spokane Symphony, Louisville Orchestra, Dayton Philharmonic, Charlotte Symphony, Nashville Symphony, Shreveport Symphony, San Antonio Symphony, Ballet Metropolitan and the Akron University Opera.

Schram's studies have been largely in the European tradition under the tutelage of Franco Ferrara, Rafael Kubelik, Abraham Kaplan and Neeme Järvi. He has studied at the Conservatory of The Hague in the Netherlands, the universities of Calgary and Victoria, and the University of Washington, where he received the Doctor of Musical Arts degree.
