Maestro Jon Robertson, dean of The Lynn University Conservatory of Music, enjoys a distinguished career as a pianist, conductor and academician. A graduate of The Juilliard School of Music, he studied piano performance under Beveridge Webster, choral conducting with Abraham Kaplan at Juilliard, and orchestral conducting with Richard Pittman of the New England Conservatory of Music and the Gewandhaus Orchestra (Germany). His conducting career

spans the globe from symphony orchestras in Norway, China, Egypt, South Africa and Austria to the Redlands Symphony Orchestra in California, where he has been principal conductor since 1982. Robertson continues to guest conduct and perform in concert as a member of the Archduke Trio.
