Jie Ren was a National Finalist in the MTNA-Steinway Young Artist Competition after being declared winner of the Florida-MTNA Young Artist Competition and winner of the MTNA Southern Division Young Artist Competition. She was born in China and started to study the piano at age four. Currently she studies at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music in Boca Raton, Florida with Roberta Rust in pursuit of a Bachelor's degree. Last fall she was a finalist in the Ars Flores Concerto Competition and 2011 LYNN Concerto competition. This past summer she attended the Chautauqua Festival in upstate New York and was a finalist at the festival's piano competition. Jie also attended the Rebecca Penneys Piano Festival. She studied previously at the Affiliated Music Middle School of the Sichuan Conservatory of Music with Professor Daxin Zheng. Jie won first prize at "The 13th American Oberlin International Piano Festival, Sichuan Selection Competition" and later received a grant from the committee to attend the International Piano Festival at Oberlin in 2007. She won third place in the Thomas & Evon Cooper International Piano Competition, the China Selection Competition in 2009 and 2010, and also took part in the Second Chinese-American International Piano Institute, where she was invited to perform at the final concert of the festival as one of the outstanding performers.

Phillip Evans has concertized and given master classes throughout the world. Currently a member of the Lynn faculty, he has served on the faculties of the Juilliard and Manhattan schools of music. A recipient of the Loeb Award, as the "outstanding pianist" of his graduating class at Juilliard, Evans also studied at the Cherubini Conservatory in Italy. He was awarded Fulbright and Rockefeller Foundation grants, won the Gold Medal at the Vercelli International Piano Competition, placed second in the Naumburg, and was appointed Artistic Ambassador for the United States.

Pianist Philip Fowke presents a program associated with some of the great pianists of the past. Music of Chopin, Dohnanyi, Grieg, Moszkowski, Paderewski, and Sinding, will be included, as well as some lesser-known gems. Fowke will introduce and perform these works, giving something of their background and his personal association with them and the pianists who played them.

Philip Fowke, known for his many BBC Promenade Concert appearances, numerous recordings and broad range of repertoire, has appeared in many of the major concert halls worldwide with leading conductors including Vladimir Ashkenazy, Sir Simon Rattle and Gennadi Rozhdestvensky. Fowke has made recordings for EMI, Lyrita, Unicorn, CRD, Chandos and Naxos which include the concertos of Addinsell, Bliss, Delius, Hoddinott, Rachmaninoff, Ravel and Tchaikovsky. He has also recorded the complete Chopin Waltzes, Chopin Sonatas, and Rachmaninoff's Piano Concerto No. 2 and the Paganini Rhapsody with the RPO conducted by Yuri Temirkanov on EMI. Philip Fowke has recently performed with The Prince Consort in the Wigmore Hall, Cheltenham Festival, and the Concertgebouw Amsterdam.
