Born in Changhua County, Taiwan, Chien-I Yang has had a remarkable career as a classical and contemporary pianist. A prize-winning performer of numerous awards, Ms. Yang has received 1st prize of the College Byrd Piano Ensemble Competition, 2nd prize in the Piano Competition of Changhua County, and 3rd prize in the Kawai Solo Piano Competition. She most recently won the Ars Flores Concerto Competition 2010 and performed with the Ars Flores Symphony Orchestra at Rose & Alfred

Miniaci Performing Arts Center performing Gershwin's Piano Concerto in F. She has performed in master classes given by Gary Graffman, Rebecca Penneys, Monique Duphil, Thomas Schumacher, Edna Golansky, Phillippe Entremote and Arie Vardi and has been broadcast live on WXEL radio several times. From the summer of 2010 to 2011, Ms. Yang has been a scholarship student at the Chautauqua Music Festival in Chautauqua, NY. Aside from Ms. Yang's engagements as a soloist, she is an in-demand chamber musician, musical theatre pianist, and bandleader. Ms. Yang presently is a member of the South Florida-based chamber group the Core Ensemble, as well as being a regular bandleader for the South Florida theatre group Entr'Acte Theatrix. Described by Hap Erstein of the Palm Beach Post, "Chien-I Yang heads an accomplished three-piece combo, and plays a mean keyboard." Her past musical theatre collaborations were You're A Good Man Charlie Brown and How To Succeed In Business Without Really Trying. In between her studies and concertizing, Ms. Yang gives public recitals to the communities of Palm Beach County. Beginning her studies on the piano at age five, Ms. Yang was admitted to the music department of Taichung second senior high school by age fifteen, and received her Bachelors of Music Degree at Soochow University under Professor John D. Vaughan. Ms. Yang received her Masters of Music Degree in solo piano at Lynn Conservatory of Music in Boca Raton, Florida, as a student of the distinguished Dr. Roberta Rust. Currently, Ms. Yang continues her studies with Dr. Roberta Rust at Lynn Conservatory of Music, where she is pursuing her Professional Performance Certificate in solo piano.
