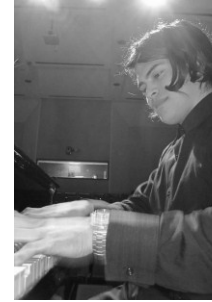

Born in Miami Beach, Florida, pianist **Stephen Seto** is a master's student majoring in Piano Performance at Lynn University. He began playing piano at the age of five and is currently under the tutelage of Roberta Rust. He completed his Bachelor in Music at the University of Miami, studying with Tian Ying. Stephen was first place winner of the Fourteenth Annual Scholarship Competition presented by the Palm Beach County Music Teachers Association. In 2006 Seto was among 11 outstanding young pianists performing for the Chopin Festival Young Pianists Concert in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. He accompanies students of all instruments but enjoys making music with his brother Kevin and sister Kristen, who are violinists. Stephen likes playing the harpsichord, ukulele, guitar, spearfishing and surfing.
