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GREGORY MILLER horn

Gregory Miller is equally at home as Soloist, Chamber Musician or Symphonic Horn player. A graduate of the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, Mr. Miller continued graduate study at Boston University. His orchestral experience has included the Pittsburgh Symphony with Lorin Mazel, Colorado Music Festival, Honolulu Symphony as principal horn and the New World Symphony under Michael Tilson Thomas. With the New World Symphony, Greg appears as a soloist on the Grammy nominated recording "Tangazo" on the Argo Decca label. After recording two CD performances and touring hundreds of concerts with the EPIC BRASS, Mr. Miller became a founding member of the New World Brass who have recorded on the Argo Decca label, performed at the Ojai Festival and for Prince Albert of Monaco and US President Clinton.

In addition to extensive touring of Japan, United Kingdom, and Europe with various groups, Gregory has also performed with the Empire Brass in Boston, Toronto, New York and at a benefit concert for the Philadelphia Orchestra, all to great critical acclaim. He has served on the faculty of Boston University Tanglewood Institute Empire Brass Seminar, the University of Hawaii, Florida Atlantic University.

Mr. Miller is currently on the faculties of the Lynn University Conservatory of Music and the University of Maryland (College Park).

LISA LEONARD piano

A native of Washington, D.C., pianist Lisa Leonard enjoys a versatile career as a soloist and chamber musician.

Ms. Leonard made her debut in 1990 with the National Symphony Orchestra in six concerts at the Kennedy Center. She has performed throughout Europe with orchestras including the East/West International Symphony of Germany, the Northern Virginia Youth Symphony and the International Music Festival Orchestra with whom she recorded the Shostakovich First Piano Concerto for Hessiches Rundfunk. Ms. Leonard has also appeared with the Alexandria, Winston-Salem and Raleigh Symphonies and has been featured on National Public Radios' "P.M. Program" and "Command Performance" programs.

Lisa has appeared in recital throughout the United States, Europe and Russia, as well as Japan where she performed with members of the Vienna Philharmonic as a participant of the Pacific Music Festival. Most recently she completed several extensive tours throughout the western United States under the national Community Concerts organization. Her interest in promoting new works has resulted in several premieres of both solo and orchestral music including the 1999 premiere recording of Mel Lewis' Sonata. She has participated in the Gilmore International Piano Festival, Caramoor and the East/West International Festival where she was assistant director of chamber music.

Ms. Leonard served on the faculty of the North Carolina School of the Arts from 1996 through 2000 where she received her high school diploma as a student of Eric Larsen. She received her M.M. and B.M. from the Manhattan School of Music where she was the premiere recipient of both the Rubinstein and Balsam awards, two of the highest awards given.

As a new resident of Miami, Ms. Leonard serves on the piano faculty at Barry University as well as the piano staff of the Conservatory of Music at Lynn University.

Her former teachers include Marc Silverman, Isidore Cohen, Thomas Schumacher, Cynthia Phelps, David Geber and the Meadowmount Trio.

CLAUDIO JAFFÉ cello

Claudio Jaffe is currently Dean of the Conservatory of Music and Director of the Music Preparatory at Lynn University, and Resident Conductor of the Florida Youth Orchestra. Dr. Jaffe has been a frequent concert soloist throughout North America, South America, Europe, and Asia.

LAURA HILGEMAN MILLER violin

Laura Hilgeman Miller has held violin positions with the Pacific Music Festival (Japan), Schleswig-Holstein Festival (Germany), Fontainebleau Conservatoire (France), as well as concertmaster of the prestigious Spoleto Festival (Italy and Charleston, SC) and associate concertmaster of the Colorado Music Festival in Boulder. Currently, Ms. Miller performs with the St. Barth's Chamber Festival (French West Indies) and the Monadnock Music Festival Orchestra of New Hampshire.

KRYSTOF PIPAL horn

Krystof Pipal holds the position of associate principal horn at the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra. Mr. Pipal is an alumni of the Conservatory of Music, where he worked with artist-faculty Gregory Miller.

LAURA WILCOX viola

Ms. Wilcox is currently the professor of viola and coaches chamber music at the Conservatory of Music at Lynn University. Outside of her solo recitals, she performs regularly with her colleagues of the Conservatory. Ms. Wilcox is also member of the "Nova Trio" which features works for viola, clarinet and piano.

LISA JUNG violin

A native of South Korea, Lisa Jung is a sophomore at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music. Ms. Jung is a student from the studio of artist-faculty Sergiu Schwartz.

SARAH PERKINS viola

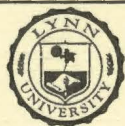
