He has performed with the New York Philharmonic, Cleveland Orchestra, The Philadelphia Orchestra, NHK Orchestra in Tokyo, Dallas Symphony, Oregon Symphony, Seattle Symphony, and with the major orchestras of Baltimore, Boston, Cincinnati, Los Angeles, and Minneapolis. He toured Canada with Pinchas Zukerman and the National Arts Centre Orchestra, and performed with the Tokyo Quartet and Joshua Bell. Parker has recorded for Telarc with André Previn, Yoel Levi, and Peter Schickele. A versatile performer, he has jammed with Doc Severinsen and Bobby McFerrin, and collaborated with Audra McDonald and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir. Mr. Parker was awarded his country's highest honor, the Order of Canada, in 1999.

Taiwanese Percussionist **Chun-Yu Tsai** has performed with the Taipei Symphony Orchestra, the Purely Professional Orchestra and the Taipei Symphonic Band in Taiwan. Ms. Tsai holds a Bachelor Degree from the Taipei National University of the Arts in Taiwan where she studied with Kuen-Yean Huang, a member of Ju Percussion Group. In 2008, she was a finalist for the Taipei Symphony Orchestra Section Percussion Audition. Ms. Tsai moved to Boston three years ago to

pursue her Master of Music at Boston University as a student of Timothy Genis, the Principal Timpanist of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. In 2010, she participated in the Tanglewood Music Center where she worked under renowned conductors such as Christoph von Dohnányi, Herbert Blomstedt, John Williams, Michael Tilson Thomas, Rafael Frühbeck de Burgos, Robert Spano and Stefan Asbury. Now Ms. Tsai is a second year conservatory student at Lynn University to seek her Professional Performance Certificate degree with Edward Atkatz, the former Principal Percussionist of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra.



Pianist **Zhou Jiang** was born in Kunming, Yunnan province. She began her piano studies at the age of 5, studying with the China Musicians' Association, where she obtained Piano Performance Level 10 (Highest Level) at age 13. Ms. Jiang completed her undergraduate studies at Shanghai Conservatory of Music, where she graduated with a Bachelor's in 2008. There she took part

in many performances with fellow students and faculty. She has performed concerts in Germany, France, Austria, Belgium, Holland, and Luxembourg. She has won top prizes in the junior division of the Richard Strauss Competition held in her native Kunming. She has also been invited to Bowdoin International Music Festival as a Performance Associate, where she performed many master classes and concerts. Ms. Jiang is currently studying at the Conservatory of Music at Lynn University, where she has studied with Lisa Leonard.
