

Hornist **Erin Huang** made her debut as a soloist at age of 15 performing Hindemith Horn Sonata at the Vancouver Kiwanis Festival Showcase Concert in Burnaby, British Columbia. From 1998 to 2000, Erin won many competitions in the Great Vancouver area and was invited to participate in the provincial competitions. The outstanding achievements in the competitions have won her opportunities to

perform solo works at the British Columbia Music Festival Concert in Prince George, BC in 1999. Erin first started her music education on piano at age four. In her early years, she as a pianist has also won several awards for piano; she had come to 2nd place in the Romantic piano 15 and under division and 3rd place in the Chopin piano 15 and under division of the CDMF Performance Arts Society, BC competition. Being a former pianist, she still plays occasionally with friends and colleagues. During her undergraduate years, she played the piano in the Boston University Wind Ensemble. As an orchestral musician, she was a member of the Vancouver Youth Symphony Orchestra under the baton of Arthur Polson and the Vancouver Academy of Music Orchestra. During her years in Boston, she was a member of the Dudley Orchestra of Harvard University, and was invited to play with the New England Conservatory Youth Orchestra on their tour to Venezuela and Brazil in 2005 under the baton of Benjamin Zander. She was also sub- listed for Hingham Symphony Orchestra in 2006. During her study at Lynn University, she is actively involved with many regional ensembles and orchestras. Born in Taiwan, Erin moved to Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada at age 13. She received her Bachelor degree in performance from Boston University, where she studied under the highly-acclaimed soloist Eric Ruske. Her former private teachers also include Jeff Nelsen, Brian G'Froerer, Barbara Hill, and Eli Epstein. She had also participated in the master classes of James Sommerville, William Purvis, Dale Clevenger, Hans Clebsch, Charles Vernon, William Caballero, and Corbin Wagner. After getting her Master of Music at the Conservatory of Music at Lynn University, Erin is currently pursuing her professional performance certificate in brass performance studying under Gregory Miller from Empire Brass.
