

Venezuelan violinist **Rafael Betancourt** has appeared around the world as a soloist, chamber musician and orchestral player. After just two years of study, he gave his debut as soloist with one of the youth orchestras of the Venezuelan "Sistema" at the age of twelve. He received a full scholarship to study with José Luis García Asensio at the summer course

of the Reina Sofia School of Music in Spain, and shortly after was selected to receive a scholarship to continue his studies with Thomas Moore at the New World School of the Arts in Miami, Florida. He also received a full scholarship to attend the prestigious ENCORE School for Strings in 2004, where he studied with the renowned pedagogue, Linda Sharon Cerone of the Cleveland Institute of Music. Rafael has participated in the String Seminar organized by Florida International University and the Amernet String Quartet, where he studied with Shmuel Ashkenazy and Charles Castleman. In 2010 he played in a masterclass festival in Montepulciano, Italy organized by the Hochschule für Musik Köln (Cologne, Germany), where he received lessons from Ariadne Daskalakis. In addition he has studied with and participated in masterclasses with musicians such as Rachel Barton Pine, Ilya Kaler, Jean-Jacques Kantorow, Stephen Majeske, and Elmar Oliveira. Recently, he has performed chamber music throughout North and South America and in Europe, including several concerts with Craig Mumm, the Principal Violist of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra in New York. Mr. Betancourt has been a member of the Youth Orchestra of the Americas for several years and was Principal Second Violin in 2008. With this group, he has completed several orchestral and chamber music tours of South America, Central America, North America, and Europe. In 2009 he was selected to become a member of the Schleswig-Holstein Musik Festival Orchestra based in Germany. With their chamber orchestra he released a CD and toured Europe several times, and in 2010 he performed in a 6-week tour of North America with the full orchestra, Christoph Eschenbach and Lang Lang. He has also performed with internationally renowned ensembles such as the New World Symphony and the Simón Bolivar Youth Orchestra of Venezuela. In 2009 Rafael received his Bachelor of Music degree from Florida International University under Robert Davidovici with a full scholarship. Currently Rafael is working towards his Master of Music degree with a full scholarship at Lynn Conservatory of Music in Boca Raton, Florida under the tutelage of Carol Cole. This summer he will perform in Lorin Maazel's Castleton Festival in Virginia as well as tour with the festival and Mr. Maazel to Canada and China.
