

Kelsey Alice Lin was always in love with music. From the second she entered the world her path wasn't hard to figure out. Music has always been a rewarding experience for this young violinist. Before she could walk Kelsey began playing the violin. She attended the Bak Middle School of the Arts, and later the A.W. Dreyfoos Jr. High School

of the Arts. She is currently at The Conservatory of Music at Lynn University on full scholarship. Kelsey has soloed with the Dreyfoos Philharmonic and Chamber Orchestras. Kelsey was the Principal violinist of the Transylvania Orchestra at the Brevard Music Center in 2006, and also was a part of the elite 'Il Solisti' group during that same summer. Oddly enough, Kelsey began formal lessons in High School with Carole Simmons, former member of the Florida Philharmonic. Her sophomore year of high school she began lessons with Rebecca Lautar, the violin professor of Florida Atlantic University. She also studied with Austin Hartman, violinist of the Biava String Quartet at the Indiana Summer String Academy in the summer of 2007. Kelsey has participated in Masterclasses with world-renowned violinists Oleh Krysa and Elmar Oliveira. Kelsey is currently studying violin with Carol Cole, violin professor at Lynn University Conservatory of Music.
