A native of Burlington, New Jersey, Christopher Tusa is at equally at home in chamber, solo and orchestral ensembles. Chris has studied with artists such as Michael Parola, of the Core Ensemble; Jim Baker, Principal Percussionist of the New York City Ballet; and Dick Horowitz, Principal Timpanist of the New York Metropolitan Opera. He has played in master classes given by Dick Horowitz, Jim Baker, Cynthia Yeh, Principal Percussionist of the Chicago Symphony, Matt Strauss, Percussionist

with the Houston Symphony and Neil Grover of the Boston Pops.

An avid freelance percussionist, Chris has played with some of the top orchestras of South Florida, such as the Southwest Florida Philharmonic, Boca Raton Philharmonia, Atlantic Classical Orchestra, and Palm Beach Symphony. This past year he was the principal percussionist in the season opener of the Miami Lyric Opera House's production of La Boheme. Chris has also played in the premier performances of Face Off by Andrew Houckins, Percussion Duo by Manuel de Murga, and Fling by Phillipe Bodin. This past year Chris was invited to play in the Texas Music Festival to study with Brian Del Signore and Matt Strauss, both of the Houston Symphony. And for the past two years Chris has been the principal timpanist with the Las Vegas Music Festival. Christopher is currently seeking his Master's in Music Performance at Lynn University, with his primary teacher Ted Atkatz.



Philip Smith, Principal Trumpet of the New York Philharmonic, has been with the orchestra since October 1978, when he was appointed as Co-Principal Trumpet by Zubin Mehta. Hisearly training on the cornet was under the tutelage of his father, Derek Smith, himself a renowned cornet soloist. He is a graduate of The Juilliard School, having studied with Edward Treutel and William Vacchiano. While still at Juilliard, Mr. Smith was appointed to the Chicago Symphony Orchestra by Sir Georg Solti, in January 1975.
