- 42% of undocumented people in the United States are uninsured.
- 18,000 people die annually because of lack of healthcare
- Due to an undocu-person's lack of SSN, they aren't able to qualify for state health insurance

- information on various specialists that will treat them regardless of documentation or insurance status

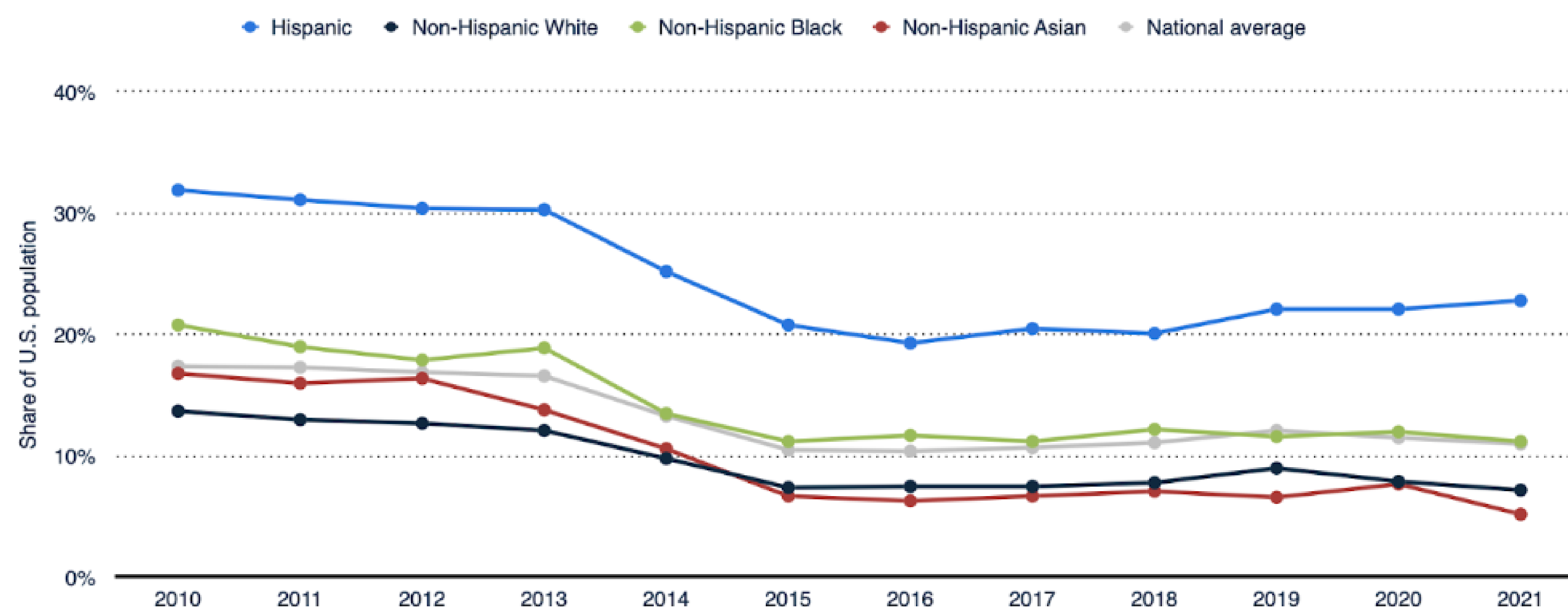
The Lasting Impact

Percentage of people without health insurance in the United States from 2010 to 2021, by ethnicity

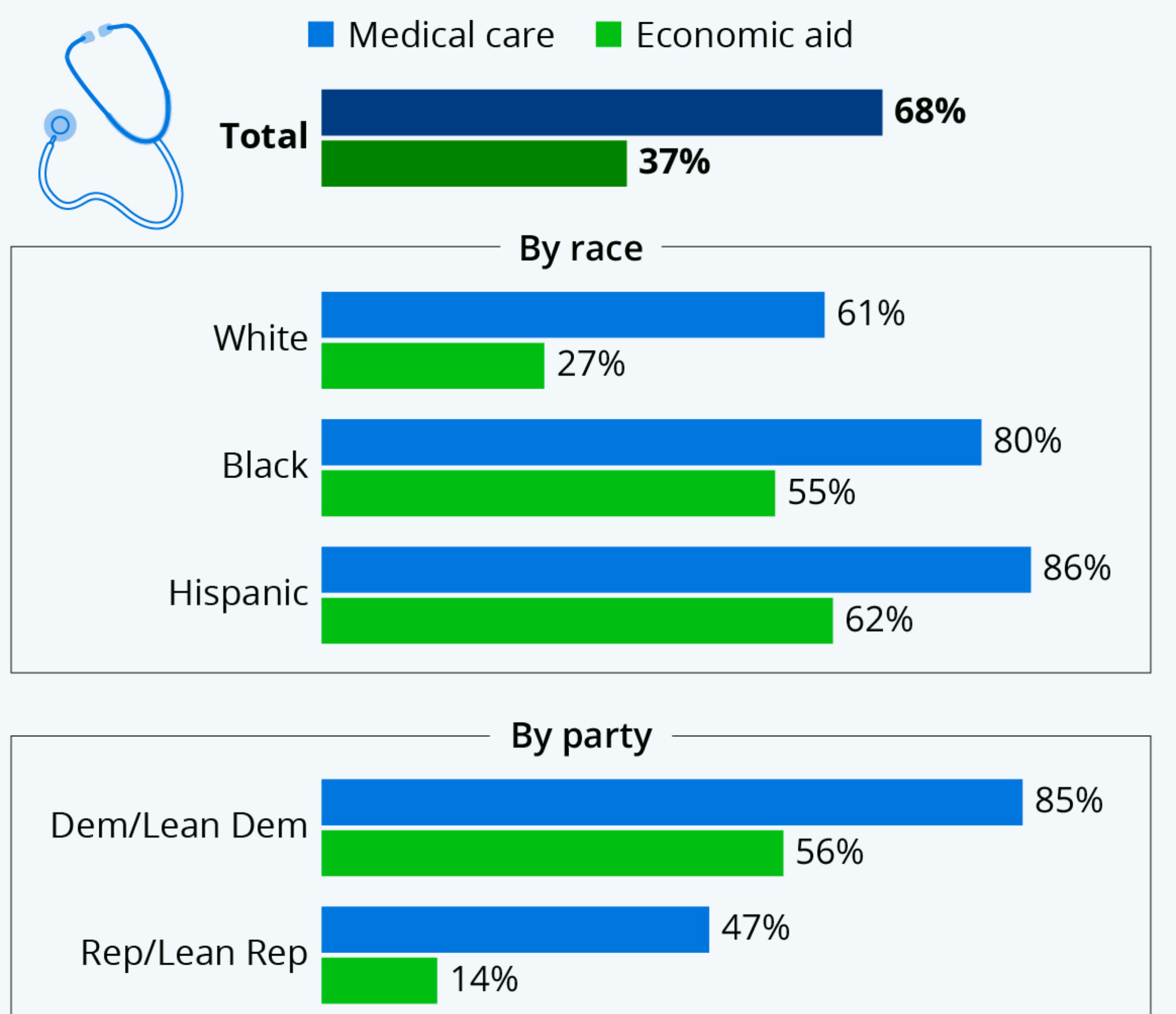
Percentage of people in the U.S. without health insurance by ethnicity 2010-2021



Description: In 2021, almost a quarter of the Hispanic population in the United States did not have health insurance, up from a historical low of 19.3 percent in 2016. In 2021, the national average was 11 percent. White Americans had a below average rate of just 7.2 percent, whereas 11.2 percent of Black Americans had no health insurance. [Read more](#)
