Pianist Inara Ferreira is native of Brazil, currently pursuing her Professional Performance Certificate at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music in the class of Dr. Roberta Rust. In 2004, she received her Bachelor's Degree in Music from UNESP (Sao Paulo State University) in the class of Dr. Gloria Machado. In 2005, she graduated from the Tatui Conservatory of Drama and Music and was awarded the Student of

the Year prize. She won the Santa Marcelina National Competition in 1997. In 2007, she was the finalist of the Ars Flores Competition, in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. Along with her family, Ms. Ferreira created a choir for underprivileged children in Botucatu, Brazil, called Nucleo Assistencial Joanna de Angellis Choir; most recently they also began an orchestral program. She is the accompanist for the Botucatu City Choir and the group Eurythmy from Brazil. Ms. Ferreira has participated in music festivals, such as the International Festival of Brazilian Colonial Music and Ancient Music in Juiz de Fora (Brazil), as well as the International Meeting of Pianists of Tatui Conservatory. She also participated in many masterclasses with renowned artists such as: Olga Kiun, Antonio Bezzan, Miriam Braga, Maria Jose Carrasqueira, Jonathan Coo, Thomas Hecht, Lilia Boyadjieva, and others. Ms. Ferreira received grant from FAPESP for the project "Master Composers of the Art Institute", developing intensive research about contemporary music, supervised by Dr. Gloria Machado. Member of "LUCC" (Lynn University Collegiate Chapter) and MTNA (Music Teachers National Association), she has significant experience in musical education and pedagogy, teaching in many music schools in Brazil, and also as a private piano teacher. Currently she is working as a piano teacher in the Conservatory of Music Preparatory School at Lynn University.
