# DANA TOLAN

was born in Romania and started violin studies at age seven in Bistrita, her hometown. Later she moved to Cluj, and studied violin with Adrian Cardan at the Sigismund Toduta music high school. During her highschool years she received recognition in national and international competitions playing as a soloist with the high school and Gheorghe Dima conservatory orchestras. She toured with the Lyzeum String Quartet and the Dana Tolan/ Nicoleta Ion violin/ piano duo, with which she also won the Special Award of the jury at the *Mozart* International Chamber Music Festival in Cluj, Romania.

Dana came to the United States to continue her music studies in 1999 and completed her Bachelors Degree at Bowling Green State University in Ohio, where she studied with Professor Vasile Beluska. During this time she participated in recitals and master classes both as a soloist and as part of the Ridge String Quartet, with whom she also performed a recital at the Romanian Cultural Center in New York City and in Cincinnati, Ohio. She later pursued a Certificate Program in Orchestral Studies at Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan, studying with members of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

Dana has wide orchestral experience, having played in numerous community orchestras in Ohio, Michigan, and Florida. She is currently enrolled in the Master's program in violin performance at Lynn University, Boca Raton, Florida, studying with Professors Sergiu Schwartz and Elmar Oliveira.


