DMITRI POGORELOV

A First Prize winner at both the 2005 National Society of Arts and Letters Violin Competition and the 2004 William C. Byrd International Young Artist Competition for Strings, Dmitri Pogorelov is a prizewinning young virtuoso violinist and a seasoned performer.

Dmitri is the youngest member of a well-known family of outstanding musicians in his native Russia. He won the international violin competition held at the prestigious Gnessin School in Moscow and the International Competition for Chamber Music in St. Petersburg before coming to the United States in 2001.

Dmitri continued to garner awards, including top prizes at the 2004 Michael and Madelyn Savarick Music Scholarship Competition of the Mizner Centre of the Arts, the 2003 Strad Violin Competition and the 2003 Ludwig Spohr International Violin Competition in Germany. Dmitri has appeared in solo recitals, and as a soloist with orchestras in the United States, Germany, Italy, France, Japan, and Russia, where he performed in the most prestigious concert halls of Moscow and St. Petersburg, including Rachmaninoff Hall of the Moscow Conservatory, Maly Hall of the St. Petersburg Conservatory, and the St. Petersburg Stadtskapella.

Following a performance with the Greater Palm Beach Symphony, the **Palm Beach Daily News** praised his "stellar performance" of the Tchaikovsky Concerto, as "an artist making his own statement... with the skill and panache of a player twice his years," while **The Flint Journal** music critic reported that "...the audience was collectively stunned by Pogorelov's fearless technical display. Clearly this young artist has the makings of a violin superstar."

May 2005, Dmitri Pogorelov received his Bachelor of Music Degree in Violin Performance "Magna cum Laude" from Lynn University, where he has been studying with Professor Sergiu Schwartz at the Conservatory of Music since 2001. Dmitri is presently enrolled in the Conservatory's Professional Performance Certificate program.

Tao Lin

Tao Lin's appearances in Asia, North America and Europe have brought unanimous critical accolades and praise for his subtle, intimate pianism and brilliant technique.

As a soloist, he has performed with Winnipeg Symphony, Miami Chamber Orchestra, Knoxville Civic Orchestra, University of Miami Symphony, Harid Philharmonia, and Lynn University Chamber Orchestra. A devoted chamber musician, Mr. Lin performs regularly with the renowned Jacques Thibaud Trio, as well as Miami, Bergonzi, Alcan, and Rosalyra String Quartets. He has also collaborated with distinguished soloists such as Ida Haendel, Charles Castleman, Roberta Peters, Eugenia Zukerman, Philip Quint and Sergiu Schwartz.

Mr. Lin was awarded top prizes in the competitions of the National Society of Arts and Letters, the Music Teacher's National Association, Palm Beach International Invitational amongst others. He was also a finalist in the 1st International Piano-e-Competition and the 1st Osaka International Chamber Music Competition as a member of the Shanghai Trio.

Mr. Lin has worked with a series of distinguished teachers including Joseph Kalichstein, John Perry, Leon Fleisher, Rita Sloan, Stephen Hough, Ivan Davis, and Roberta Rust. He has recorded for the Piano Lovers record label, and features works by Mozart, Beethoven, Schubert, and Balakirev.
