Winner of the Lynn University Concerto Competition in 2005, Ciprian has performed in a recital at Council of Europe, Strasbourg France, Paganini Conservatory Concert Hall, Genova, Italy, Youth Orchestra of Ilmenau, Germany, Recitals at FIMU, Belfort, France, Weber Concertino (with Lynn Philharmonia). He also participated to FIMU Festival (Belfort, France), International Contemporary Music Festival (Romania), International Music Festival (Brasov, Romania) having the great honor to work with Klenyan Csaba, Stefan Korody, Ioan Goila, Emil Visenescu, Franklin Cohen, Paul Green, and Richard Hancock. In present, he is pursuing the Bachelor of Music Degree at Lynn University under Mr. Jon Manasse's guidance.
