# **Artist Biographies**



## Terence Kirchgessner

A native of Rochester, New York, Terence Kirchgessner began his conducting studies at the age of fifteen with Jeff Greene, a prominent wind conductor and award-winning educator. He was accepted to the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam where he conducted the wind ensemble, early music ensemble, string

orchestra, chamber orchestra and held the position of Assistant Conductor of the Crane Symphony Orchestra.

A versatile conductor, Kirchgessner's engagements have included a performance with the rock band Dashboard Confessional, performances at the Muse Awards, conducting singers from the Palm Beach Opera and Florida Grand Opera and a yearly musical theater production with Jan McArt. He has also conducted ensembles at the Hartwick and New York Summer Music Festivals as well as the Clarkson University Orchestra, the Lynn Conservatory Chamber Orchestra, the Lynn Philharmonia, the Treasure Coast Symphony, the Broward Symphony and the Symphonia of Boca Raton.

Mr. Kirchgessner is currently the Staff Conductor at Lynn Conservatory of Music in Boca Raton, Florida, the Music Director of the Broward Symphony in Davie, Florida and the Music Director Emeritus of the Treasure Coast Symphony in Fort Pierce, Florida.

Terence Kirchgessner holds a Bachelor of Music from the State University of New York at Potsdam and a Master of Music from Lynn University. His primary conducting mentors were Timothy Topolewski, Chris Lanz and Jon Robertson.



# Askar Salimdjanov

Violinist Askar Salimdjanov was the 2018 winner of the Lynn Lyric Chamber Music Competition which presented him and pianist Feruza Dadabaeva in their New York debut on the Kosciusko Foundation Music Series. In 2019, Askar also won the Fourth Annual John Olivera String Competition. Mr. Salimdjanov has performed as soloist with the Uzbekistan National Symphony Orchestra, State Conservatory Orchestra of Uzbekistan and

additional chamber orchestras under the batons of K.Usmanov, V. Neymer, K.Urinbaev, A.Paris, and E. Azimov. He has given solo and chamber recitals in Russia, Ukraine, Italy, Singapore, Israel, and the United States.

A laureate of the 6th International Competition of Young Performers in Moscow (2009), he was also a finalist of the 2nd Yankelevitch International Violin Competition (2011), winner of international competitions in Ukraine and Italy (2009), and laureate of Vladimir Spivakov's International Music Festival in Moscow (2010). Askar attended the Keshet Eilon Mastercourse (Israel) in 2016 and 2018, the Singapore Violin Festival 2016, 2017, and the Heifetz International Music Institute in 2017 (USA). Askar received his Bachelor of Music degree from the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music in Singapore where he studied with distinguished concert violinist Qian Zhou. Mr. Salimdjanov began his training at age 7 attending the V. Uspenskiy Special Music School for Gifted Children in Tashkent, Uzbekistan as a student of Gulnara Suleymanova. Askar has participated in masterclasses with David Takeno, Takashi Shimizu, Valeriy Sokolov, Itzhak Rashkovsky, Ilya Kaler, Rosa Fain, Hagai Shaham, Eduard Grach, Silvia Marcovici, Gabor Nagy Takacs, Midori Goto, Tang Quartet, Victor Tretyakov, Emerson Quartet, Hagen Quartet, Borromeo Quartet, Boris Kuschnir, and Pierre Amoyal.

Askar is currently pursuing his Professional Performance Certificate under the guidance of renowned violinist Elmar Oliveira at the Lynn Conservatory of Music.

## **About Lynn Conservatory**

Lynn's newest performance space, the Snyder Sanctuary, is an inspiring place where people of all faiths and belief systems can come together for contemplative thought, spiritual exploration, meditation, music and celebration. The intimate 220-seat Amarnick-Goldstein Concert Hall hosts concerts, competitions and master classes. Opened in 2010, the 750-seat Wold Center hosts the Lynn Philharmonia, Lynn Wind Ensemble, the Elmar Oliveira International Violin Competition, the Roger Voisin Memorial Trumpet Competition and other large conservatory events.

Now in its 27th season as a full symphony, the Philharmonia is an integral part of the education of the conservatory's graduate and undergraduate music students.
