

Before transferring to the Conservatory of Music at Lynn University Josh first attended Washburn University in Topeka, KS where he sat principle trumpet in both the orchestra and wind ensemble. While attending Washburn he was also able to play with the Topeka Symphony Orchestra as well as play solo trumpet with the Marshal's Band. Participating in summer festivals since leaving high school, Josh has attended the Sunflower Music Festival twice where he performed in chamber ensembles coached by members of Empire Brass as well as the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and has attended the Las Vegas Music Festival twice where he was fortunate enough to study with both Jeff Kay and Marc Reese. Josh's primary teachers include Brian Rood, Dr. Philip Clark, and his current teacher – Marc Reese.
