Artist Biographies

The **Contrast Duo** is an internationally renowned ensemble whose concerts around the world were received with critical acclaim and enthusiastic response. They recently were awarded Best Interpretation for Franz Liszt and won First Prize at the 2017 Franz Liszt International Festival and Competition [aka: Liszt-Garrison Festival and International Competition.] The recipient of the National Society of Arts and Letters scholarship for two consecutive years, the duo has won the Gold Medal Prize for Best Instrumental Music from the Global Music Awards, have made the finals of the Fishoff, Coleman, and Carnegie Hall Fellowship competitions, being generously supported by the Boca West and Boynton Beach Communities in their projects.

This summer of 2017, the duo performed the Complete Beethoven Sonatas for Piano and Violin and has concluded an international tour in Russia, Philippines, and throughout the United States. They were featured at “The Making of WE: A Broward Centennial Celebration” documentary, TV5 Philippines, and 1M TV Russia.

Russian violinist **Yasa Poletaeva** is a graduate of the Saint Petersburg Conservatory, Russia. She is the winner of the John Oliveira String Competition, Lynn University Concerto Competition, Moscow Chamber Music Competition, and a recipient of the Boca West Country Club Scholarship. She has appeared in International Festivals throughout Europe and the United States. Miss Poletaeva is a published author and has been a sought-after poet in Russia. She is a violin student of the internationally renowned violinist, Elmar Oliveira.

Filipino pianist **Darren Matias** is a coveted soloist and chamber musician. He appeared as soloist of the Charlotte Symphony, FilHarmonika, the New York Summit Festival Orchestra, Lynn Philharmonia, Philippine Philharmonic, University of Santo Tomas Symphony and Florida Atlantic University Symphony. He has participated in the masterclasses of Gary Graffman, Leon Fleisher, Arie Vardi, Philippe Entremont, and Alexander Toradze. He was a guest orchestra pianist to the South Florida and New World Symphony, and is now the music director of the Saint Michael Lutheran Church.

The members of the Contrast Duo received their respective Masters and Performance Certificate degrees at Lynn Conservatory of Music. They are pursuing their Chamber Music Performance Certificate degree as a recognized duo ensemble at Lynn University under the renowned tutelage of Lisa Leonard and Elmar Oliveira.
