Sarah Perkins, viola

Sarah Marie Perkins is a native of Jacksonville, Florida. She is a student of Michael McClelland of the Sarasota Philharmonic, and is currently working toward her Bachelor of Music at Lynn University in Boca Raton, Florida. She has given performances in Denmark, France, Japan, Canada, and throughout the United States. She is an active orchestral musician, having participated in the Florida International Festival chosen as one of two violists to perform as members of the London Symphony. The following year she performed with the National Festival Orchestra in Carnegie Hall and was honored with the National Symphony Orchestral Award for outstanding musicianship. She also performs locally with the Greater Palm Beach Symphony and Symphony of the Americas.

During the summer Ms. Perkins has performed at prestigious music festivals such as the Tanglewood Music Festival, Meadowmount School of Music, and Eastern Music Festival. While at the Eastern Music Festival, she performed in masterclasses for Mr. Isomura (Tokyo String Quartet) and Chauncey Patterson (Miami String Quartet). Ms. Perkins has given chamber music concerts at Meadowmount School of Music in New York, Killington Music Festival in Vermont and Festivale du Graves in Bordeaux, France. As an avid chamber musician, she has been coached by George Crumb in his composition <u>Black Angels</u> for Electric String Quartet and by Aaron Jay Kernis in his composition <u>Goblin Market</u>. Her teachers have included Jorge Pena, Igor Fedatov, Laura Wilcox and Michael Zaretsky of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. Ms. Perkins future plans include attending Yale School of Music for her Masters degree in Viola Performance.
