Daniel Andai, violin

Biography

Daniel Andai is a two time Laureate of the International Young Soloist Festival in Moscow where he performed in a series of concerts with the Moscow State Symphony Orchestra. He has performed with several orchestras such as the New World School of the Arts Symphony Orchestra, New World School of the Arts Camerata, Ars Flores Symphony Orchestra, Miami Symphony Orchestra, Alhambra Orchestra, FIU Symphony Orchestra, Luzerne Festival Orchestra, Lynn University String Orchestra, Lynn University Philharmonia Orchestra, International Virtuosi Camerata, Amelia Island Orchestra among others.

Daniel is also a winner of numerous competitions including; the Lynn University Conservatory of Music Concerto Competition, the Florida International University Concerto Competition, Florida Federation of Music Club winning the Concerto Competition and All-Performance, South Florida Youth Symphony Concerto Competition, ARTS Columba Bush scholarship competition, Bach Festival Competition, the Mount Dora Spring Festival competition twice and laureate in the Walenstein Violin Competition. As a winner of the Florida Philharmonic Young Artist Competition, he has performed with the Philharmonic and the Beethoven by the Beach Festival Orchestra in a series of concerts throughout South Florida during their 2002-2003 season.

As chamber and orchestra musician, Dani is the co-concertmaster of the Miami Symphony Orchestra; concertmaster of Alhambra Orchestra; former concertmaster of the Dade-County Honors Orchestra (for five consecutive years), Lynn University Philharmonia, Luzerne Festival Orchestra; principal second violin of the Virtuosi Camerata, and the Florida Youth Orchestra where in 2001 received the Joseph Leavitt Award. He has also received awards for outstanding concertmaster from the New World School of the Arts and the South Florida Youth Symphony. Daniel is also first violin of the Millennium String Quartet which received 1st prize in the Meeroff Chamber music competition. He has studied with and played in master classes for the Meadowmount trio, violinist Regina Carter and others if various music festivals. In 2004, he will be featured as violist in chamber programs in the Sun Coast Chamber Concert Series in Florida. He has performed for world dignitaries such as Prime Minister of Poland Lech Walesa, First Lady of Florida Columba Bush, former Vice-President of the United States Al Gore, former First Lady of the United States Senator Hillary Rodham Clinton and Prime Minister of Israel Benjamin Netanyahu.

Daniel is a scholarship Academic Honor Student at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music where he is under the tutelage of artist faculty Sergiu Schwartz playing both the violin and viola in the chamber music programs. Previous teachers include Margaret Pardee at the Killington Music Festival, Vermont, Cyrus Forough at the String Academy at Indiana University and the Meadowmount School of Music, New York, and legendary violinist Rugierro Ricci at the International Academy of Music of Montpellier, France. He has been a featured performer in Russia, Bahamas, Jamaica, France, Israel, Canada and throughout the United States. He has also performed in several masterclasses and collaborated with distinguished artist such as Nestor Torres, Pinchas Zukerman, Elmar Oliveira, Nina Kogan, Julius Milkes, James Judd, Arthur Weisburg, Joseph Silverstein, Angel Romero and others.

Daniel is a recent recipient of the FL ASTA Young Artist Award for his dedication to music and involvement with the musical community. He also received the Dean's Award for Achievement at the NWSA along with a certificate for Outstanding Musical Achievement, Dedication and Performance. He has been selected as an All-American Scholar in 2000 and featured in "Who's Who among American High School Students." He also appears in the 2002-2003 National Dean's List. He has won scholarship competitions sponsored by the Boca Pops, the Jewish Arts Foundation, and the South Florida Music Teachers Association Collegiate Division.

Daniel is an avid participant in multiple musical events and public recitals and has received a Certificate of Appreciation from the City of Miami for his many achievements and involvement in the community. His participation in the Children's program Play-a-Piece-Day is highly regarded along with his involvement in the inauguration of the Kids Village Youth Orchestra of which he is an annual guest artist. He has been featured on South Florida's WXEL Radio station, as well as being a POP recording artist for AMZ records.
