Marco Navarrete, oboe and english horn

Marco came to south Florida from Skokie, Illinois and now resides in Coral Springs, Florida. He came to the Lynn University Conservatory of Music to pursue a Bachelor of Music degree, after spending 2 years pursuing medicinal studies. Marco has participated on both oboe and bassoon in the University of Miami Honor Band, All-County Band and Orchestra, North Area District Band, and the Festival of Winds at the University of South Florida in Tampa. He was a member of the Youth Orchestra of Florida, Symphonic Youth of Florida Symphony Orchestra, the Greater Miami Youth Symphony, and the Greater Miami Youth Symphony Wind Quintet.

Marco received numerous academic and musical awards including the National Recognition of Latino Students and the John Phillip Sousa Band Award. During his senior year of high school, Marco was Band Captain of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas Marching Eagles High School Band, which participated in the Tournament of Roses Parade that same year.

Along with his active playing duties at the conservatory, Marco has also been a member of several performance groups around the south Florida area. He is the former principal oboe of the Broward Symphony Orchestra, solo English horn of the Palm Beach Atlantic Symphony, assistant principal oboe and solo English horn of the Sy Sugar Pops Orchestra, principal oboe of the Gold Coast Opera Orchestra, and is now the solo oboist of the New Boca Pops Orchestra.

Marco has had the honor of working under great conductors and composers such as; Alfred Reed, James Judd, Joseph Silverstein, Glenn Quader, Sy Sugar, Arthur Weisberg, Dr. Tom Cavendish, Thomas Sleeper, Dr. George-Albert Schram, and Dr. Stuart Gardner. Marco is a conservatory student of artist-faculty John J. Dee, principal oboe of the Symphony of the Americas and former principal oboe of the Florida Philharmonic Orchestra
