Biographies

Tubist **Joshua deVries** grew up in Islip Terrace, New York where he began studying under the tutelage of William Troiano, an active freelance tubist and music educator. A senior at the Conservatory of Music at Lynn, Joshua has also studied at the College of Fine Arts at Boston University as well as James Madison University's School of Music. Currently, Joshua serves as a Substitute for the Ocala Symphony Orchestra in Ocala, FL. In addition, Joshua recently performed with the South Florida Philharmonic as well as Broadway star, Idina Menzel. This past summer, Joshua served as tubist for the Chautauqua Institution Music School Festival Orchestra in Chautauqua, NY, where he studied for the summer. In addition to his orchestral experience, Joshua won First Place in the Student Tuba Division of the 2010 Leonard Falcone International Tuba & Euphonium Competition. He was also Runner Up in the 2012 U.S. Army Band, "Pershing's Own" Mock Audition Competition. Joshua is a student of Ken Amis of the Empire Brass and West Palm Beach Opera Orchestra. His teachers also include Mike W. Roylance, Boston Symphony Orchestra, and Toby Hanks, former tubist of the New York City Ballet.

Taiwanese Pianist **Claire (Ting-Tzu) Chiu** started her piano lessons at the age of five. Ms. Chiu has won 2005 Piano Competition of Taoyuan County, 2007 Piano Competition of Taipei City and 2008 the Sonata Competition of Piano and String at Soochow University. She has performed in master classes with Pebecca Penneys, Jonathan Plowright and Phillip Evans. In 2010, she participated in the Chautauqua Summer Music Festival. Ms. Chiu received her Bachelor's of music degree at Soochow University in Taipei under Professor John D. Vaughan. She received her Professional Performance Certificate at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music under Dr. Roberta Rust. Ms. Chiu is currently pursuing a Master's of music degree at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music in the studio of Lisa Leonard.

VIOLIN MASTER CLASS WITH ELMAR OLIVEIRA

Thursday, Nov. 1 at 7 p.m.

Elmar Oliveira, distinguished Artist-in-Residence at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music, is the only American violinist to have won the Gold Medal at the Tchaikovsky International Competition in Moscow and is one of the most distinguished violinists in the world today. His wide-ranging recordings have earned him a Cannes Classical Award and a Grammy nomination, and have appeared on Gramophone's "Editor's Choice" and other "Best Recordings" worldwide. In addition, he has launched his own recording label, Artek Recordings (www.artekrecordings.com). He performs on a 1729/30 Guarneri del Gesu called the "Stretton" and on several outstanding contemporary violins. Violin students performing in this master class are from the studios of Elmar Oliveira and Carol Cole.
